RE: FY 25/26 Vehicle Seal Inspections and Container Permitting

Dear Hauler:

The Wilton solid waste and recycling agreement requires that haulers collecting; transporting and/or disposing of solid waste materials in Wilton obtain a registration from the Housatonic Resource Recovery Authority (HRRA) to operate within the boundaries of Wilton. To obtain your municipal registration and transfer station permit, please visit [www.HRRA.org](http://www.HRRA.org) for your annual application which is due July 31, 2025.

In addition to HRRA's requirements, Wilton requires that the vehicles used for collecting; transporting and/or disposing of solid waste materials must have its seal inspected in order to obtain the registration from HRRA. Wilton also requires that you obtain container permits for all of your commercial garbage and recycling containers in Wilton. This must be done prior to submitting your HRRA application.

Enclosed are the collectors seal inspection forms, which must be completed for each vehicle that will be used to collect solid waste materials within Wilton. Also enclosed is the container form. Please bring all forms to the Public Works Office located in the Town Hall Annex.

**The seal inspection fee is \$500 per vehicle. Seal inspections must be completed no later than June 30, 2025. Please call for an appointment at 203-321-3987.**

**The container permit fee remains at \$50/container and must be affixed to the containers no later than August 1, 2025.**

If your Wilton transfer station billing is not current through **May 31, 2025**, you will not be eligible for municipal registration and transfer station permit from HRRA.

As a reminder, all refuse and recyclable materials must originate from within the geographical boundaries of Wilton.
