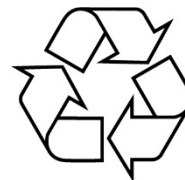




Important Update: Changes to Curbside Recycling in Newtown



Town Program Ends December 31, 2025 – What You Need to Know

What's Changing

As of December 31, 2025, the Town of Newtown will no longer provide curbside recycling services.

What You Should Do

1.) If you currently use a private hauler for curbside trash disposal, they will be required by state law to offer you recycling services. They are required to offer combined waste and recycling services for a single fee. The Town does not mandate which hauler you use or how much they charge.

Best practice:

- Get at least three quotes when comparing private hauler services to ensure you're getting a competitive rate.
- Ask if they offer Unit-Based-Pricing (you pay only for what you generate)
- Ask potential haulers if they will provide you with containers for both trash and recycling, and options for frequency of pickup.

2.) All Newtown residents can recycle for free at the transfer station with a biannual permit.

3.) Transfer station permits will only be available to Newtown residents and at no charge.

How to Choose a Hauler

Choose a hauler from the chart below who is permitted to collect in Newtown. These haulers are registered through the HRRA and are vetted to have the appropriate insurance and licenses. It is a state requirement that haulers register in any municipality they operate.
